

### **President's Award**

### **MNLICA Issues at the State Capitol**

Plans are being made to visit the Minnesota State Capitol on February 8<sup>th</sup>. Here are a few issues

### Concerning Drainage:

Some environmental groups are pushing legislature to establish a drainage registry. This is for public ditches, also known as Judicial or County ditches. It would require the drainage authority to submit information for maintenance actions, as well as repairs. After submitting the information to an agency like BWSR or DNR, there would then be a comment period, during which no work could begin.

MNLICA holds that NO REPAIRS should be required to report on a registry. Since these actions are returning a system to an "as designed" capacity, it is not changing flows or output.

At this time, no language has been introduced and there are no house or senate file numbers.

Senate File 2 and House File 2 are intended to change paid time off for employees. If these bills pass and are signed by the governor, a new agency will be formed and a new tax will be assessed on employers. This program would allow for up to 26 weeks of paid time off for things like medical issues.

The Minnesota Chamber of Commerce brings up the points that employers are already struggling to fill job openings while operating in one of the most regulated business climates in the nation.

MNLICA holds that overregulation and high tax loads make operating in Minnesota prohibitive.

Recreational marijuana is again a topic for the legislature. A number of groups oppose the passage of legislation that will cut prosecution for marijuana usage, some stating that this will make our roads more dangerous. Promoters say that making marijuana illegal doesn't work.

MNLICA contractors are required to have safe work sites and to monitor their drivers. Legalizing recreational marijuana takes our state in the opposite direction.


### **Executive Director's Report**





### **CREAMY SLOW COOKER POTATO SOUP**

**3 CUPS PEELED & CUBED POTATOES** 

1/2 C. CHOPPED CELERY

1/2 C. CHOPPED ONION

1 C. CHICKEN STOCK



### **Safety Focused**



### Working Safely in Cold Weather

Winter weather poses a number of safety risks, particularly for employees who spend a lot of time working outdoors. Prolonged time in the cold may result in serious ailments or even death. Injuries and illnesses associated with exposure to extreme cold include:

- Frostbite—This condition occurs when the skin is exposed to cold or windy weather or comes into contact with cold objects or surfaces. Common symptoms include numbness; red skin with gray, white or bluish patches; hardened skin; and skin that blisters after being warmed.
- Hypothermia—This condition occurs when your body temperature drops below 95 degrees Fahrenheit.
   Symptoms include shivering, confusion, brain fog, slow breathing, low energy or fatigue, bright red skin, loss of coordination and slurred speech.
- Trench foot—This condition occurs when the foot is exposed to wet and cold temperatures for a prolonged period of time. Common symptoms include swelling; numbness; cold, blotchy and red skin; itching or burning sensations in the foot; and a feeling of heaviness in the appendage.

Any employees who can't avoid working outdoors in cold temperatures may be at risk of these ailments. The likelihood of cold weather-related injuries and illnesses may be heightened among workers who take certain medications, are in poor physical condition or have specific health problems (e.g., diabetes, high blood pressure and heart disease). To keep yourself safe while working in cold weather, consider the following tips:

- Wear several layers of loose clothing.
- Ensure your ears, face, hands and feet are protected.
- Wear waterproof and insulated boots.
- Take frequent, short breaks in warm areas.
- Drink hot beverages and eat warm, high-calorie foods before working and during breaks.
- Learn the signs and symptoms of cold weather-related ailments to help identify them in yourself and among co-workers on the job.

### Safety Alert Highwall Safety



Since CY 2012, falling rocks and materials from hazardous highwalls have resulted in 9 mining fatalities and 27 serious injuries.



A miner was fatally injured at a surface coal mine while operating a front-end loader to remove shot rock near the base of a 63 ft. highwall.



A miner was severely injured while working near the base of an approximate 65 ft. highwall. The miner was struck by loose, fractured and overhanging rocks.

### **Best Practices**

- Develop and follow a plan for the safe control of all highwalls where miners work and travel in close proximity to the highwall.
- Train miners to recognize highwall hazards.
- Conduct highwall examinations and assure hazards (loose rocks, overhangs, trees, etc.) are taken down or supported prior to work or travel near the highwall. Examine more frequently after rain, freezing and thawing.
- Scale highwalls to eliminate hazards, e.g. loose rocks or overhangs. Perform scaling
  from a position that will not expose miners to injury. Until hazards are corrected, place
  warning signs or barricades to prevent entry.
- Restrict highwall height to allow available equipment to safely scale the highwall. If benching is necessary, provide adequate bench width based on the type of equipment used for routine clearing or scaling operations.
- Develop blasting plans and use proper blasting techniques. Examine highwalls after blasting.
- Remove trees, vegetation, and unconsolidated material a safe distance from the top edge of highwalls.
- · Never park equipment, perform maintenance or store materials beneath highwalls.
- Use diversion ditches or slope the ground so that surface runoff drains away from highwalls.
