

#### PLAN FOR HEALTH CARE FUTURE

This is based on an article from The Scoop by Greg Krogstad.

Over the past year we have been on a rollercoaster of uncertainly when it comes to our economy, our banking system, & our health care. The passing of the Patient Protection & Affordable Care Act (PPACP), as well as the Health Care & Education Affordability Act of 2010 created some certainty.

Health care will mean different things, both positive & negative for MNLICA members.

It is impossible to capture the entire PPACP bill, but here are some key points that could affect your business.

**January 2010:** Businesses with less than 25 full-time employees & average annual wages less than \$40,000.00 qualify for a tax credit up to 35%. This credit is based on the employer paid portion of health coverage.

**June 2010:** Health insurance companies may not impose any pre-existing condition exclusions.

**September 2010:** Health insurance companies must offer coverage for children under the age of 26, regardless of marital status, & cannot exclude children with pre-existing conditions.

**January 2011:** Employers must report the value of health coverage on the employees W-2. This is for informational purpose only & will not result in additional taxable income. A simple Cafeteria Plan will be created by the government for small businesses (less than 100 employees). January 2013: Health flexible Saving Account contributions are limited to \$2500.00 annually. No limit has previously been imposed. This may increase the taxable income for employees with health expenses exceeding \$2500.00. January 2014: Under the Promoting Employer Responsibility portion of the law, a business with more than 50 fulltime equivalent employees is required to provide health insurance or pay a \$2000.00 per employee fine. Full-time is defined as someone working over 30 hours per week for more than 120 days. Employees working less than 30 hours per week are defined as part time. Part time employees must be added to your full-time equivalent employee count by dividing the monthly hours worked by 120. The first 30 employees are excluded from the fine. For example, a business with 70 full time employees would pay a penalty on 40 employees if coverage was not offered. Employers will face a \$3000.00 fine for every employee that selects the federal tax credit option rather than the employer option when the employer health coverage option is "unaffordable", or exceeds 9.8% of income. Once more is know, it is important for MNLICA members to develop a long term strategy with their insurance agent.



#### LICA WASHINGTON DC LEGISLATIVE MEETINGS

The men meet with 7of our 9 legislators on Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday. They also had breakfast with several others and Senator Al Franken.

The following points MNLICA members discussed with Legislators were:

- 1. Farm Taps: LICA is requesting that our federal legislatures work with sate legislatures to mandate pipeline companies to locate what is now termed as a "private farm tap". To this point in time gas line companies do not feel that it is their responsibility to mark more than the main gas line. Numerous MN. Contractors have cut the private farm line without injury, but deaths have occurred in WI. It looks like we will need to focus harder on our state legislatures if we are going to move forward.
- 2.Clean Water restoration Act: MN. Representative James Oberstar introduced this bill in 2007. It was delayed in 2007 & 2008. As written, it would place "ALL Waters" in the U.S. under the jurisdiction of the Federal government. It includes all intrastate waters & their tributaries, including lakes, intermittent stream, mudflats, wetlands, sloughs, potholes, wet meadows, ponds, impoundments, etc. If put into effect a written, it would require a federal permit to replace a tile line, put in a storm sewer, or install an irrigation ditch. He plans to reintroduce this bill this year yet.
- 3. American Clean Energy Act H.R. 2454: The claimed purpose of this bill is to contain global warming by reducing carbon dioxide & other greenhouse gas emissions. The "cap & trade" proposal would severely limit the amount of energy generated from coal, oil, & natural gas. If the bill is enacted, this would constitute the biggest government takeover of the economy since WWII & possibly bankrupt our nation. LICA opposes this bill.
- 4. Employee Free Choice Act: (known as "Card Check"). Congress is introducing a union-organizing bill that will allow a union to form after enough workers in a shop sign cards, rather than voting by secret ballot. LICA is opposed to this bill for three reasons, a. it could effectively eliminate the secret ballot election, which is a cornerstone of our representative Constitutional Republic, b. it would short circuit the collective-bargaining process after 120 days, allowing an arbiter to impose contract terms neither the union or the company has sought, & c. it would replace remedial penalties for NRLB violations with punitive fines that could drive some firms into bankruptcy, while imposing no fines for union misconduct. The men also met with the National NRCS and went over the following items:
- 1. The new NRCS from MNNRCSAD016, "information release form" In the past contactors & people requesting information for a farm needed to get a "Certificate of Identity" form signed by the landowner so that Farm Service Agency & NRCS could release the information requested. NRCS will no longer recognize the Certificate of Identity, & will only acknowledge the MNNRCSAD016 form.

- 2. American Recovery Act funding that we discussed in our 2009 edition is phasing out & will expire at the end of 2010.
- 3. EQIP funding for controlled drainage structures have been approved, but it will only cover structures installed by contractors that are certified installers. We advise all of our members involved with drainage practices to get certified. Contract ADMC

#### TANK REMOVAL REQUIREMENTS

## Requirements for removing underground storage tanks

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency requires contractors that install, repair, or remove regulated underground storage tanks, such as those used at a gas station or for non-residential heating purposes at a church, hospital, apartment building etc., to be certified by the MPCA Tanks Unit. Removing these tanks without first obtaining MPCA-Certification is illegal.

Removals must be conducted by MPCA-Certified Contractors with an MPCA-Certified Supervisor present and the MPCA must be notified both before and after the project. As more and more aging and inactive tanks in Minnesota are being removed, the MPCA realizes there will be an increased potential for earth-moving contractors without MPCA Certification to be asked to remove regulated underground storage tanks, and some may unknowingly do this illegally. Illegal tank removals are subject to MPCA enforcement action.

In order to become an MPCA-Certified Supervisor, a person must have tank removal experience, be employed by an MPCA-Certified contractor and take an MPCA course. Then the person must complete an application, pay a fee, and receive a wallet card with a unique certified supervisor number which demonstrates successful completion of the certification process.

In order to become an MPCA-Certified Contractor, a company must employ one or more MPCA-Certified Supervisors, complete an application for certification, pay a fee, and receive a certificate which demonstrates successful completion of the certification process.

MPCA-Certified Supervisor class topics cover standard removal and waste management practices, including purging or inerting tanks of hazardous vapors and requirements for soil sampling beneath tanks and various system components to determine if contamination is present.

Non-certified contractors with excavation equipment can remove regulated underground storage tanks <u>only</u> if there is an MPCA-Certified Supervisor present during all critical junctures of the project. Certification is not required for removal of aboveground storage tanks, but proper industry standards and soil sampling protocol must be followed.

If you are contacted by a tank owner to remove an underground storage tank, be aware of these requirements to ensure the tank is removed properly and legally.

MnLICA has put on seminars with representatives from the Minnesota Department of Revenue in the past year and we seem to be getting contradicting advice from tax revenue representatives. The chance for someone in the trucking (hauling) business being audited within the next three years is very likely as the State of Minnesota is searching for funds. So at least you want to try and do this right or it could be costly to you. This is my take on it. If you have a customer that wants a load of rock for their driveway. You go to the quarry charge the rock to your account. The quarry charges you for the rock plus sales tax. When you deliver it as of 2008 it doesn't matter if you spread it or place it you should charge sales tax on the delivery. If you are a hired trucker delivery aggregate for a quarry to an asphalt plant and the load is to be used for road construction No Tax on Delivery.

Don't take my word as law. Check with the Minnesota Department of Revenue. This is confusing!

Also snow-plowing and hauling is non-taxable, but treegrubbing if not on a building site is taxable.

This became effective July 1, 2009.

On May 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, some of your LICA leadership team visited Washington DC and marketed LICA with agencies and other professional and industry organizations that support our objectives. The team consisted of Immediate Past President and Chairman of the Board Bruce Barnhart, President Dirk Riniker, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Steve Gerten, CEO Jerry Biuso, and Director of Government Relations John Peterson.

After traveling to Washington on Tuesday, May 5<sup>th</sup>, the group met early on Wednesday morning to review the schedule. Their day started at the Longworth House Office Building and the office of Representative Steve King (IA-5<sup>th</sup>). Rep. King is a former LICA Region IV Vice President who serves on the House Agriculture, Judiciary, and Small Business Committees. The meeting was supposed to be with King's Senior Legislative Assistant Brent Boydston, but while we were waiting for Brent, out came Rep. King and he stayed and talked with us for about 20 minutes. What a treat! He told us about getting started in the contracting business, how he first got interested in politics (and he credited past LICA President and current president of the Land and Water Magazine, Ken Raasch with that), and what his personal priorities were. He also alerted us to something going on with rural water districts that LICA may want to watch. We all very much enjoyed Rep. King taking time to be with us. Bent Boydston joined us and we discussed ConExpo, invited him to attend and be part of our legislative session. He will also follow up on the rural water issue and get John more information. That was just an outstanding way to start our visits.

From the House of Representatives it was off to the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) and a visit with new NACD CEO Jeff Eisenberg. Some of you might want to ask Bruce and Steve about their cab ride to NACD. They took the scenic route. In addition to introducing ourselves to the new NACD CEO, we discussed how Soil and Water Conservation Districts around the country were involved in the TMDL process, talked about exchanging exhibits at each other's conferences, and agreed to look for projects or activities we could work on together. Bruce

and Jerry met Jeff at the NACD meeting in Orlando in Feb. John has known him since their USDA days. One of Jeff's priorities is more individual district project activity and funding from non-government sources. That should be good news for many LICA members

After lunch at nearby Union Station, our team headed to the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). There they met with ASCE's Director of Federal Relations Caroline Matcheska, and Allison Dickert, who is the driver for ASCE's Infrastructure Report Card work. In addition to discussing the infrastructure grades, we learned about the reauthorization of the highway bill, and our team thought they might ask the LICA Legislative Committee to look at it and se if we might take a position in support. Caroline will work with John on this legislation.

From ASCE it was on to the Portland Cement Association (PCA) and a visit with David Hubbard, PCA's Vice President for Legislative Affairs. Here we talked about cap and trade and why it is not going away. Our meeting was cut short, as David had to take part in a teleconference on the highway reauthorization bill.

or 1 med. Tomato, seeded and diced


1 cup salsa (your choice of brand)

1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese




#### DRUG AND ALCOHOL COMPLIANCE

#### Straight Pipe Status thru 4/15/10

The Straight Pipe law (Minn. Stat. 115.55), which became effective August 1, 2006, is being used by 19 counties and 1 township to address 265 cases of straight pipe discharges to date. Straight pipes, for the purposes of this law, are defined as a sewage disposal system that transports raw or partially settled sewage directly to a lake, stream, drainage system, or ground surface.

The intent of the law is for counties and townships to put straight pipe owners on notice that they have 10 months to correct or eliminate their illegal straight pipe discharge. If the offending straight pipe owner fails to comply within the 10 month period, the case is referred to the MPCA for the collection of a \$500 per month penalty for each month past the 10 month period that the straight pipe remains in operation.

The number of cases referred for state enforcement since the effective date of the law now stands at 265 cases. The following breakdown shows the distribution of the 265 cases to date by category:

- · 226 cases are in the No Further Action category because they qualify for one the following designations:
  - 7 cases have been extended beyond the 10 month compliance date at the request of the county.
  - 35 cases have been suspended at the request of the county
  - 184 cases have been fixed or resolved to the satisfaction of the county.
- · 37 cases are still within the 10 period, and are being tracked by MPCA. Upon expiration of the 10 month period, MPCA initiates enforcement action.
- · Enforcement action is pending on 2 cases.

## MPCA Enforcement – Second Half 2009 By Pat Shelito, MPCA Brainerd

During the period July 2009 - December 2009, MPCA enforcement staff finalized 10 enforcement actions on companies or individuals, referred to as Responsible Parties in the enforcement world. These enforcement cases totaled 12 % of all MPCA enforcement actions reported during this period. Nine Administrative Penalty Orders (APO) and one Stipulation Agreement were issued to the Responsible Parties. The MPCA issues APOs and Stipulation Agreements to resolve compliance problems and ISTS licensure issues. The severity of the enforcement action depends on several factors, including the number of violations, environmental impact of the violation, whether it is a repeat offense, and how quickly the problem is corrected. The penalty monies are deposited in the state government general fund.

The Responsible Parties cited in the second half of 2009 were B & B Drain Cleaning & Pumping, Inc. (Rice County), Matthew's Drainage & Excavating, Robert Matthews (McLeod County), Randy's Pumping Service (Rock County), Corey Seppman Well Drilling Co. (Blue Earth County), Seifert Septic Service (Ottertail County), R & J (Todd County), Meyers Cozy Corner Campground, Inc. (Stearns County), American Septic Service (Pine County), Aaron Heyn (Blue Earth County), and James Smith (Jackson County).
