Land Improvement Contractor Short Course

by Curtis Larson

St. Paul, Minn.—The first Land Improvement Contractors Short Course was held at the Agricultural Engineering Building on the University of Minnesota, St. Paul Campus on February 26 and 27. Over 100 people attended the talks on drainage and soil conservation, panel discussions, and laboratory sessions on welding and eath moving.

A. F. Moratz, Engineer for the Soil Conservation Service from Milwaukee, pointed out that Minnesota land improvement contractors should equip and train themselves for building the many small structures that will be required for erosion control and drainage in the future. Everyone concerned will be better off if the same contractor can do both the earth moving and concrete work.

Paul Jacobson, State Engineer for the Soil Conservation Service, in his talk on "Trends in Terracing" said that parallel terracing is now practical and is rapidly replacing nonparallel terraces in many states. Although this requires heavy earth moving equipment, the cost is still low considering the benefits. Furthermore, terraces must be made parallel if they are to be farmed with 4 or 6-row equipment.

Alf Larson, State Representative from Hayfield spoke at a dinner meeting on February 27 and discussed legislation affecting drainage and soil conservation activities, including the highway bill and the wetlanda bill-which were passed by the 1957 legislature.

A new contractors organization was formed and will be known as "The Minnesota Land Improvement Contractors". Orlean Olson of Montevideo, Minnesota, was elected president. Local groups have already been organized in both Southeast and Southwest Minnesota.

In another session, Milton Maxwell, LeSeuer farmer and president of the Minnesota Association of Soil Conservation Districts explained the role of the districts in soil conservation. He pointed out that Soil Conservation Districts are governed by farmers of the district and that their purpose is to provide local cooperation to go along with the technical assistance provided by the Soil Conservation Service. 
ist explained how the Soil Conservation Service carries out its program through area and county offices with trained farm planners, soil scientists, and engineers.

In the drainage session, K. R. Klingelhofer, Assistant State Engineer for SCS showed that the use of automatic pumping plants as tile drainage outlets is becoming a common practice and discussed construction methods. Phil Manson, Professor of Agricultural Engineering, explained the Minnesota drain tile testing program and said that the better tile quality which has come from it, has been of great benefit to the farmers of the state.

Laboratory sessions were also held at the short course. Representatives of several companies showed the contractors how to apply hard-surfacing to machine parts, thereby saving on replacement costs. Charles Jett of the Caterpillar Company showed contractors how to calculate hourly operating costs.

This weather will reduce the tile installed this spring but it will promote more tiling for sum-mer and fall work. There are fewer projects this spring but as a rule they are larger than what they were a year ago. The Editor was out completing a preliminary survey in a combination of ankle-deep water and hip-deep snow. Most of the work that was done in March was done under these conditions though, as you are well aware. I understand this year that the Soil Conservation Service is again requiring complete records of tile drainage work. On the back page of TDC is a sample of notes submitted by the Soil Con-servation office. Note the list of information that is required for each job. This particular sample was suggested by Henry W. Waldorf, Work Unit Conversationist of Black Hawk county.

This is a follow-up to an email sent to this same distribution list on April 19th concerning CenturyLink's challenges with completing facility locates in a timely fashion. Here are the key actions that CenturyLink and our locate contractor DirectSat have taken since:

- Nearly quadrupled the workforce dedicated to locates.
- Expanded our dispatch center to handle inquiry and escalations from excavators relating to open and recently completed locate requests (1-800-667-9963). I attached a contact sheet that includes the dispatch center number and list of local field contacts, should you need to contact us regarding locate status or issues.
- Implemented a proactive communication process (in place as of today) for locate requests that are at risk of being missed by the due date/time:
- For "Emergency" tickets, this is a phone call to the number listed for the requestor to make the excavator aware of the expected completion window.
- For "Meet" tickets, this is an auto message or text with notification that we are running behind, along with a way to reach us for more information.

We are nearly staffed to the level needed to keep up with the volume of locate requests we are receiving. However, we have backlog that we have to contend with, so we continue to add both contracted and company resources to help catch up and deal with increasing volumes as the dig season ramps.

I will be hosting an informational Excavator Forum on **May 6th at 8am Central** along with the Minnesota Office of Pipeline Safety and Gopher State One Call to provide additional information on CenturyLink's status, as well as actions the state is taking to address these performance issues.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT


The weather has definitely put us to the test so far this year. But you know, the weather isn't something we can control or do anything about so all we can do is deal with it




