PUBLIC DRAINAGE UPDATE

Through the years a number of MNLICA members have kept tabs on the Drainage Work Group (DWG). The reason is that legislation affects many of our contractor members. Being involved with the DWG gives insight into what regulations may be coming and also provides an avenue to have a say in the process.

Much of the efforts of the DWG concern "public ditches" which some people refer to as "103E ditches" as the code that authorizes the public ditch is numbered 103E.

So, what is a public ditch? It is a ditch or tile line that is owned by the people that pay for it, but a government unit is responsible for administrative duties. That is often a watershed district or the county commissioners.

When a ditch is undersized or failing the owners can "petition" to have it repaired or improved. An Improvement often involves enlarging the system, and also brings in engineers, and other agencies such as the DNR and BWSR. There are very specific steps that must be taken during the process. These range from who, when and how parties are notified, to what an engineer must consider during design and construction.

PUBLIC DRAINAGE UPDATE (Continued)

Typically, the people notified are the ones paying for the system. However, certain environmental groups believe that any person should be allowed to know that a system is proposed, and have introduced legislation that would establish a searchable database. This is based on their opinion that farm drainage causes flooding and is responsible for polluting waters downstream. These groups believe they should be able to comment, and have at times attacked the projects through the legal system.

The establishment of a searchable database that would list all drainage projects is one of the major issues at the DWG. This proposal has been introduced twice at the state capitol.

The second issue centers on the term "outlet adequacy" which is something an engineer must consider when designing an improved system. Basically, the body of water receiving the flow from a public drainage system must be adequate to handle the increased flow. In this case, the term "outlet" refers to the body of water receiving the flow from the public ditch. At this time the engineers are considering adequacy based on flow, but the environmentalist groups think that the assumed nutrient load should also be considered. Further, the drainage code does not specifically define how far downstream engineers must evaluate. Currently, it appears that little will change at this time, though the term "outlet" is going to be redefined to some extent, as the culvert on the end of a system is also referred to as an "outlet."

The DWG meets monthly when the legislature is not in session. The next meeting is planned for October 12th at the Minnesota Farmers Union building in St. Paul. It can also be accessed through Microsoft Teams. Contact Stu Frazeur if you are interested in attending.

Discovery Farms Project Highlights Drainage Management

The Discovery Farms Minnesota program and Farmamerica hosted a field day August 16 to provide an up-close look at the newest Discovery Farms project focusing on tile drainage.

Discovery Farms Minnesota is a farmer-led effort to gather field scale water quality information from different types of farming systems, in landscapes all across Minnesota. The mission of the Discovery Farms program is to gather water quality information under real-world conditions. Currently there are 10 monitored sites on 5 farms across Minnesota. The program has been in place since 2010 and has collected water quality information on more than 40 farms.

Farmamerica is a non-profit organization working to connect Minnesotans to the evolving story of agriculture through hands on educational experiences, partnerships, and community engagement. Hosting this drainage research project on their farmland will allow Farmamerica visitors to learn more about the role of tile drainage in supporting crop production and addressing water quality and quantity concerns.

This project involved installation of a new tile system, engineered to allow controlled drainage in 4 separate zones. The field had been tiled more than a half-century ago, but the system was not performing properly, resulting in frequent crop losses and potentially higher nutrient losses. The new system, which was installed in December of 2022, is expected to drain the farmland more uniformly. In addition, the ability to control the water level within the soil is expected to reduce total tile flow and nitrate movement.

Initially, the 4 zones will be allowed to drain freely whenever soils are saturated. After a calibration period, 2 of the zones will be managed by raising the water level within the soil during periods when field access is not necessary. Analysis will include water volume and nutrient concentrations, along with yield and field trafficability factors. This phase of the research will focus on an assessment of controlled drainage.

With the infrastructure in place, longer term research could include practice comparisons, potentially involving precision fertilizer management, tillage, cover crops and other emerging practices.

Primary support for this project was provided by Minnesota Natural Resources Conservation Service. In-kind support was provided by Prinsco, who provided tile; Ellingson Drainage, who installed the system; and AgriDrain, manufacturers of the controlled drainage structures. The Minnesota Department of Agriculture provides equipment and monitoring expertise for all Discovery Farms locations in Minnesota. Additional financial support is provided by the Minnesota Corn Research and Promotion Council.
